



CALL FOR SATELLITES

The Organizing Committee of the ICM 2022 in Saint Petersburg is calling for proposals to hold satellite conferences, workshops and schools either before or after the Congress. As satellites form an integral and crucial component of the ICM, the organizing committee encourages an active response from the mathematics community in proposing and organizing satellites.

Proposals should be sent to satellites@icm2022.org and will be considered as they are received. A complete proposal should contain the following information:

1. Title, dates, location.
2. Organizing committee, including contact person, and, if applicable, scientific advisory committee.
3. Scientific scope.
4. Keynote speakers, the total number of speakers, other scientific activities planned.
5. Expected number of participants, and ...
6. ... whether special support for young mathematicians, women, and other categories of participants is planned.
7. Approximate budget and potential sources of funding.
8. A brief news story about the satellite for the ICM website. It should include a photo of the location, a brief description of items 1-4 and 6, and a link to the conference website. Please make sure that the OC has the legal right to post the location photo on the ICM website. If a conference website is not currently available, the OC asks the organizers to produce one as soon as possible after being designated an ICM satellite.

Additionally, if the satellite is held in the Russian Federation in partnership with a local scientific organization, the organizers may apply for **funding** from the ICM budget. The application for funding should contain the same information, but with a detailed plan in items 5, 6 and 7. Schools targeting young researchers and women and scheduled directly before the ICM are particularly encouraged. The deadline for application is May 1, 2020. We expect to make funding decisions by July 1, 2020. If selected for funding, the estimated support from the ICM budget is up to 2,5 million rubles.
